ALDERPERSON REPORT


All Aldermen and Alderwomen thanked the departments for a good job and team work after the July 11th storm.

MAYOR'S REPORT


Mayor Burriss stated that he and the Aldermen and Alderwomen have been at the TML Conference and learned a lot.
