Alderwoman Holt led the invocation with the Pledge of Allegiance to follow.

Alderman Wade made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 24, 2025 council meeting. Alderwoman Jones seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote.

**RECORDER'S REPORT**

Leigh Reynolds reported the expenditures for the month. Alderman Graves made a motion to approve the expenditures with general fund being \$73,951.65 and sanitation \$7,286.06. Alderwoman Holt seconded the motion. The motion carried by voice vote.

**NEW BUSINESS**

**RESOLUTION 2025-R-6 AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING EXECUTION OF AN EQUIPMENT-LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH CADENCE EQUIPMENT FINANCE, A DIVISION OF CADENCE BANK**

Alderswoman Jones made a motion to pass Resolution 2025-R-6 authorizing and approving execution of an equipment-lease purchase agreement with cadence equipment finance for a Kenwood bucket truck. **UPDATE ON GENERAL SESSIONS LAWSUIT**

The lawsuit with District Attorney Agee, the city won in general sessions and appealate court, but the case has been appealed. Jeff Mueller stated that the supreme court does not have a time line and if they hear the case we will be asked for briefs.

Chief Cusson gave an update on fireworks. On June 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> they had complaints of fireworks being shot at others and police cars. The department went down to the area and talked to family members and stated there would be charges if it did not stop. Following that nothing really happened. He stated that there were no major problems or injuries.

**MAYOR'S REPORT**


Mayor Burriss and Alderswoman Jones are working on a non-matching grant for \$50,000 with T-Mobile for a disc golf course, 4 benches and water fountains.


July 22<sup>nd</sup> next council meeting.
