He stated Music Feast has been moved to Thursday, April 30th at 5:30 p.m.



Next Budget meeting will be on May 13th. This will be our last budget meeting. We will have the last reading of the budget on May 26th.


He thanked all department heads for their hard work and thanked the Council for all the hard work they do as well.
